thrombolytic therapy for stroke is intended for physicians who will be treating patients in the first few hours after stroke neurologists neurosurgeons emergency medicine physicians internists and radiologists in some areas fam ily medicine general practice physicians may provide the majority of acute stroke care we will provide the reader with all the data necessary to understand the utility and limitations of thrombolytic therapy by reading the protocols and working through the case tutorials the reader will become sufficiently familiar with the indications and contraindications of thrombolytic therapy to begin evaluating potential patients although nothing can replace direct instruction by more experienced physicians we hope that by imparting our accumulated knowledge we may guide those physicians who cannot attend a hands on workshop or who having heard the appropriate lectures feel the need for further guidance we will review the scientific rationale for thrombolysis first most ischemic stroke is caused by thrombo emboli second a portion of brain the penumbra remains salvageable for a few hours after vascular occlusion and third promptly delivered thrombolysis can remove the offending occlusion and restore cerebral blood flow to the

penumbra in time to salvage brain and neurologic function then we will review the preclinical development of thrombolytics for stroke patients and the early pilot trials next we will present the pivotal clinical trials that demonstrated the efficacy and safety of thrombolysis

stroke is one of the major causes of disability in the world consequently an effective rehabilitation regimen is the goal of specialists working in the field worldwide the implementation of rehabilitation programs for the stroke patient is broad in scope and requires first of all an objective scientific evaluation method in 1980 the world health organization developed the international classification of impairments disabilities and handicaps it categorized impairments and disabilities on the basis of functional evaluation but took into account cultural and socioeconomic factors when defining handicaps thus making it difficult to use the same functional evaluation instrument for the three phenomena in this monograph experts in the treatment of stroke from japan the united states and europe share their ideas presented during the 31st annual convention of the japanese association of rehabilitation medicine held in june 1994 all the participants freely contributed their views on the functional assessment and prognosis of stroke patients indeed their contributions shed light on possible breakthroughs in the future for the development of rehabilitation regimens for stroke patients

not your dad's stroke is written by a stroke survivor for stroke survivors and their loved ones it documents the author's recovery from a 2012 stroke and examines the research and treatment advancements over the twenty years since his dad had his stroke the author also discusses strategies and resources to help make recovery easier the book includes personal accounts from other stroke survivors caregivers and a therapist not all the stories have happy endings but all are informative and inspirational most newly diagnosed stroke patients are in fear of the unknown in the author's case his first thought was of his dad's stroke and how it had been the start of his dad's decline however as the author's treatment and recovery began the first thing he realized was that things had changed for the better with faster diagnoses and improved treatments from the beginning he had a better prognosis with early discussions on recovery and preventing the next stroke everyone knows someone that has had a stroke it can happen to anyone at any age no two strokes are the same as no two recoveries are the same the bottom line is that recovery is hard work survivors have to keep at it and at some point learn to accept the new version of themselves this book will be an informative resource and inspiration for newly diagnosed stroke patients anyone who has suffered a stroke and for the loved ones and caregivers of stroke survivors the manuscript was built around common questions about stroke identified through conversations with stroke survivors caregivers and peer support workers
